****Program Admission: students will be seated in Core Classes (SURG courses in Semesters Three and Four) based on successful completion of all criteria below:**

- Must be fully admitted to Nashville State Community College (declare University Parallel, Health Science AS)
- Must apply to the program during the current cycle (open year-round).
- Applications must be renewed each June to be considered for the following year.
- Must have successfully completed at least four General Education courses (including electives) listed above prior starting Core Classes.
- Must have successfully completed program prerequisites (BIOL 1000, SURG 1304, SURG 1305, and SURG 2310) with a grade of C or higher prior to starting Core Classes.
- Successful completion (grade of C or higher) of Candidacy classes (SURG 1410 and SURG 2299) in addition to the above guarantees placement in Core Cohort for the subsequent semester.
- If open seats remain in a Core Cohort after Candidates are seated, applications will be considered for applicants without credit for SURG 1410 and SURG 2299 and filled based on the following:
 - Successful completion of General Education courses
 - Completion of all program prerequisites
 - Grade Point Average in prerequisite courses

*****Students with an active certification as a Certified Registered Central Service Technician (CRCST) or a Central Service Processing and Distribution Technician (CSPDT) may receive prior learning assessment credit for the following classes:**
