Technology Updates

D2L: "Awards" Tool Now Available

The D2L Awards tool is now available for NSCC instructors. This tool allows you to grant students awards in the form of badges or certificates. For more information on using Awards to motivate your students, see this article.

D2L: New Zoom LTI Integration Now Available

The Zoom LTI integration for D2L is now available as an External Learning Tool for NSCC instructors. This tool allows you to manage your Zoom meetings within D2L, embed links to meetings and recordings, and schedule and sync meeting dates to the course calendar. To access the Zoom LTI feature, go to Content inside your course shell, then select "Add Existing Activities" and "External Learning Tools."

D2L: New "Edit Folder" Settings for Assignment Dropbox

You may have noticed that the "Edit Folder" screen for Assignment Dropbox has changed in appearance. Don't panic! Most all of the same settings are still present, just moved to a slightly different place. Faculty Spotlight: Kurstin Bush



Our first Faculty Spotlight features Kurstin Bush (Education), who has been using <u>Flipgrid</u> to promote student engagement in her online courses. Here is what she has to say about how she uses this tool to encourage meaningful student interactions:

"In the Education program it is important for students to express themselves orally and in writing. While this is easy to practice and evaluate in onground classes, it is certainly challenging in an online setting. However, modern technology has come to the rescue! Websites like Flipgrid provide free, easy to use multimedia platforms that allow students to post video responses instead of being limited to a typed discussion post. The Early Childhood and Education programs have been using this site for over 5 years now and I really like it!"

"My students post introduction videos, which allow me to put a face with a name but also are required to address particular theorists and explain, summarize and provide personalized examples in their responses. Students typically have 3 minutes to address a prompt and then are required to comment on at least 2 other students' posts just like in my written discussion boards. Seeing your classmates promotes a sense of belonging and allows verbally gifted students to shine by providing a variety of ways in which students can demonstrate what they know and can do. If you are looking to be more culturally responsive in your course, consider adding Flipgrid discussions!"
