

Nursing Requirements

The Nursing Program prepares students for a career as a registered nurse. Nursing courses include didactic and clinical training over a two-year period that includes fundamentals of nursing, pharmacology, nursing care of the adult in a medical-surgical setting and an intensive care unit, family nursing including care of children and expectant mothers, and mental health nursing. In addition to classroom education, students will participate in clinical settings in hospitals and agencies located in middle Tennessee. The program includes a course to help with the transition from student into independent clinical decision-maker. This degree program trains students to work with persons from various cultures across the life span and the wellness-to-illness continuum. At the conclusion of the program, students are eligible to take the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN).

Admission

Admission to the program is available in the fall and spring. Prospective students are required to attend an information session prior to applying to the program. At the beginning of each semester, dates and times for the information sessions are posted on the website http://www.nscc.edu/nursing. Completion of all Learning Support/developmental courses is a pre-requisite before application submission.

Acceptance into program students must have completed any/all remedial and/or developmental coursework and required General Education courses as well as math and science courses before they begin the program.

To be admitted into the nursing program students must achieve a minimum ATI-TEAS Academic Preparedness level of **Proficient**.

◆ MATH 1530 Introduction to Statistics 3 Credit hours

All pre-requisite courses must be completed with a grade of "C" or better and it is recommended that all science courses be completed within the past five years. Any grade below a "C" will not be accepted coursework towards admissions.
