

DOROTHY GAUBERT PYLE ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

The Dorothy Gaubert Pyle Endowed Scholarship was created with the generous support of Dorothy's family and the Dorothy Gaubert Pyle Endowed Fund. The Foundation is proud to continue to honor Dorothy's memory through this scholarship designed to provide financial support to NSCC photography students with an interest in black and white photography.

Recipients may be awarded up to \$1,000 per academic year, depending on available funding.

To be considered, you must submit the NSCC Financial Aid and Scholarship Form via your myNSCC portal by June 30th each year. Early submission is strongly encouraged.

To be considered for this scholarship, applicants must meet the following requirements:

Need-Based Criteria:

- Must have a family adjusted gross income of \$36,000 or less.
- Must submit an essay describing applicant's need for a scholarship.

Merit-Based Criteria:

- Must have achieved a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 or higher in college-level or high school coursework.
 - Must submit an essay describing the applicant's interest and experience, if any, in black and white photography and may submit a portfolio of no more than ten (10) black and white images created by applicant.
- May submit letter(s) of recommendation.

Universal criteria:

- Must be in good academic standing at the college.
- Must not have earned a Bachelor's Degree prior to application.
- Must be enrolled in or have completed a class in black and white photography at the college at the time of his or her application.
- Must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and the verification process.

In order to continue receiving the scholarship:

- Must remain in good academic standing for continued disbursement in the succeeding semester.
- May apply for the scholarship in a succeeding year, but no person may be awarded a scholarship for more than two years.

Applicable maintenance fee/tuition refunds will be credited to the scholarship except in cases when the student is also receiving federal Title IV benefits and totally withdraws. In such cases, the refund is credited back to the appropriate program(s) according to the NSCC "Return of Title IV Funds" Policy.
