

The Dr. Wallace Wilson Scholarship supports students who demonstrate financial need and academic merit and who have chosen to pursue an associate degree in Architectural Engineering Technology, Civil and Construction Engineering Technology, Civil Engineering, Mechanical Engineering, and Civil and Construction Engineering Technology Technical Certificate. Established in honor of Dr. Wallace Wilson, a longtime professor of architectural, civil, and construction engineering at Nashville State, this scholarship is made possible by the generosity of NSCC Alumni, friends of the College, and business and industry partners who employ graduates of these programs.

The scholarship is awarded to a maximum of two new students each semester. Each scholarship recipient shall receive \$1,000 per semester for a maximum of four semesters as long as the student maintains eligibility. Awards will be made contingent upon available funding.

To qualify, please submit your NSCC Financial Aid and Scholarship Form through your myNSCC. You must complete this form each year by May 31st. We recommend that you submit your form early. Scholarships are awarded to qualified applicants on a first-come, first-awarded basis until funds are expended. Awards will be made contingent upon available funding.

This scholarship is awarded to qualified applicants based on the following criteria:

- Applicants must be pursuing an Associate Degree or Technical Certificate; majoring in Architectural Engineering Technology, Civil and Construction Engineering Technology, Civil Engineering, Mechanical Engineering, and Civil and Construction Engineering Technology Technical Certificate.
- Applicants must be enrolled in a minimum of six credit hours.
- Applicants must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
- Applicants must have a minimum 2.5 cumulative grade point average.
- Applicants must be in good academic standing and meet satisfactory academic progress standards, as measured for federal Title IV Programs.

Students who receive the Dr. Wallace Wilson Scholarship in the fall semester must maintain a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.5 and complete six credit hours to remain eligible for the spring disbursement of the scholarship.

Applicable maintenance fee/tuition refunds will be credited to the scholarship except in cases when the student is also receiving federal Title IV benefits and totally withdraws. In such cases, the refund is credited back to the appropriate program(s) according to the NSCC "Return of Title IV Funds" Policy.
