

TED M. WASHINGTON ENDOWED MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Ted M. Washington Endowed Memorial Scholarship was established through the generous contributions of Ted M. Washington's family, friends, and the NSCC community of faculty and staff. The Nashville State Community College Foundation is proud to carry on Ted's legacy by offering this scholarship to students who are enrolled in a Computer Technology program and have demonstrated financial need.

Recipients may be awarded up to \$1,500 per academic year, depending on available funding.

To be considered, you must submit the NSCC Financial Aid and Scholarship Form via your myNSCC portal by June 30th each year. Early submission is strongly encouraged.

To be considered for this scholarship, applicants must meet the following requirements:

- Must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and the verification process.
- Be enrolled as degree-seeking student, or a recent high school graduate who completed their diploma on or after May 1st prior to the start of the award year.
- Be enrolled in a Computer Technology program, pursuing either an associate degree or a technical certificate.
- Be enrolled in a minimum of twelve credit hours.
- If the applicant has prior college-level coursework, they must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0.
- Be in good academic standing and meet the Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) standards required for federal Title IV financial aid programs.

To remain eligible for continued scholarship support, students must continue to meet the initial criteria and also:

- Maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0.
- Successfully complete at least twelve credit hours each semester to qualify for disbursement in the following term.
- Re-enroll in a minimum of twelve credit hours for the upcoming semester.

Applicable maintenance fee/tuition refunds will be credited to the scholarship except in cases when the student is also receiving federal Title IV benefits and totally withdraws. In such cases, the refund is credited back to the appropriate program(s) according to the NSCC "Return of Title IV Funds" Policy.
